Text: John 17:17-19

Proverbs 30:5 "Every word of God is pure."

Psalm 19:7-9 "The Law of the Lord is perfect...sure...right...pure...clean...true and righteous altogether."

Psalm 119:160 "The entirety of Your word is truth."

Matthew 5:18 "For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass away from the law till all is fulfilled."

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (**2 Tim. 3:16-17**).

Jeremiah 23:28-29 "...he who has My word, let him speak My word faithfully. What is the chaff to the wheat? says the Lord. Is not My word like a fire? says the Lord, and like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces?"

Acts 20:32 Paul says, "I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified."

Jeremiah 9:3 "They are not valiant for the truth on the earth."

→ Are we those of whom God would say, "They are valiant for the truth"?

3 John 3-4 "For I rejoiced greatly when brethren came and testified of the truth that is in you, just as you walk in the truth. I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."
